#### From the Archives-

In one of the Archives Committee trips to AA in Manhattan, we came across this letter we would like to share with you. The letter was undated but received by Alcoholics Anonymous World Services on January 31, 1964.

Dear Sirs:

Another group is available to the Alcoholics Anonymous program. This new group is known as the Centereach Group. Our neighboring group to the north is Port Jefferson which meets on Monday and Friday nights and to the south of us is the Ronkonkoma Group that meets on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

The Centereach Group will hold meetings on Wednesday and Sunday nights at 9:00pm. This Wednesday, February 5 will be for the election of officers. The names and numbers of these officers will be forwarded to your office in order that this group can become a member of the Alcoholics Anonymous family. Meanwhile, we will appreciate all guidance you can offer. Thank you.

Centereach Group of Alcoholics Anonymous is located at Grace Presbyterian Church, Blydenburgh Road off Horseblook Road, a quarter mile south of the bowling alley on Middle Country Road, Centereach Long Island, NY.

Interesting to note that the founders of the Centereach Group were diligent enough to have their new group meet on nights that wouldn't conflict with the already established meetings in their area.

We are always looking for background information on any groups. Sadly the founders of Centereach did not include their names in this letter...maybe someone out there can fill in that gap. Also why this meeting moved to St. Cuthberts? There are a few other Centereach meetings we would love to get some background info on....Altered Attitudes (1996-1998?) Friday Night Live (1997-1998?)

Gift of Sobriety (1992-1993?), Unity School (1995-2002?), Sunday Afternoon Group (1995-1996). Several of these met at a recovery gift shop on Middle Country Road. Maybe that will jar a memory **Or two**.

#### John the Hat

I befriended this guy, John the Hat at my then Home Group, Cleary Group, Nesconset, NY sometime around 1997. He had just come out of our local DWI facility. He did not want to drink anymore and seemed "ready." I was 14 years sober at the time, driving a 1966 Station Wagon. This guy, John the Hat, had experience restoring the older cars, and offered to begin on mine. He continued to show up at Cleary Group on a regular basis, so I figured what the heck, and dropped the car off at his girlfriend's, Debbie, ("the Queen's") house. We continued to make meetings and stay sober together and most of our discussions were about recovery in AA or the restoration of the '66 Station Wagon. After a few weeks, he invited me to come to his house and see the work he had done so far.

I entered the dining room of "the Queen's" house to find most of the top half of the engine all over the dining room floor; cleaned, painted, and laid out on newspaper! I said to myself, this guy has issues!

Two years passed and we were both still sober. Progress on the Station Wagon was limited as to availability of funds, but the engine was all painted and it looked great! John began on the body work.

John was on probation for his 4th DWI, and I met his Probation Officer many times. John did what he had to do and was finally discharged from probation. He got himself quite a good reputation with the Probation Dept. Somehow his name came up when a NY TV station was doing a Special Report on DWI's and recovery.

John called me and told me what he was intending to do. I told him he was out of his mind, and reminded him of AA's Traditions. John was always there to help out another wanting help and saw this as a giant step for helping others. I was not his sponsor and asked him if he had spoken to his sponsor about it to which he said "yes ". I told him you would be there to make sure no Traditions were broken!" His Sponsor knew me well and figured it would be okay if I was there. After all, I had 16 years sobriety! John was stubborn and his mind was made up to do this interview on the TV. He agreed and was called by the producer of the NY TV station for a taping date.

A couple of days later, the TV crew arrived with 1 reporter, 1 cameraperson, 1 audio person, and 1 driver with the TV truck. John immediately informed the TV crew of AA's Traditions on Anonymity and any other Traditions he could think of, the best he could. "By the way," he stated, "this is my friend Lou, who has 16 years in AA, and he will make sure no traditions are broken during the taping!" John needed to attend more Tradition meetings! John had a great heart, but was just two years sober at the time.

Everything John said was for a reason; the audio guy approached me on the side, and revealed he was sober 4 years! I asked him where his Home Group was, and he shared with me about his son having a tough time getting sober and he had been spending more time dealing with him and his problems than his own recovery. I told him a sober father is the best thing for his son and to get his a\*\* back into AA!

The taping lasted almost 3 hours. A lot of questions were asked about how he got and maintained his 2 years of sobriety; how was it being a drunk and today being sober, the DWI's, etc. John did well and was careful not to mention AA. He was on a high and was wondering how the TV station was

going to squeeze three hours of **taping** into a  $\prod$  hour news special.

Later that day, we were informed his interview would be on the 6pm news the next day. I set my VCR to tape it for him. The Special Report started and then John the Hat's interview came on; all 18 seconds of it! They showed a film of him sanding down an old piano stool, (we refinished furniture, too), and John stating how his life is 1000 times better now that he is sober and if he could stay sober, anyone could.

It was not what John expected and he did not appreciate the way he had been portrayed; as he called it, "rum dumb!" He then called the TV station, a little upset, and asked to speak to the President of the Station and asked them how they could edit all 3 hours of his wisdom and experience, etc, etc, into 18 seconds. The resentment eased after a couple hundred meetings after that, but he did not drink over it, and neither did I. That was the end of his TV days.

John the Hat always maintained that AA was the best thing that ever happened to him and he wanted to die sober. In December 2006, his wish came true. With 10 years of sobriety, he died from a heart attack at 56 of age. I was there along with another AA, just like he would have wanted. At his funeral, his family was surprised to find that John had so many friends. I was grateful to be one of them.

And the 1966 Station Wagon? After 5 years at the "Queen's" house, she had enough of it. I towed it to my house where it stayed for about 1 month until my wife insisted I scrap it. I did. That car kept us both sober for 5 years, along with attending AA on a regular basis.
