HOTLINE NEEDS SOME HELP

There are currently two districts in the county whose phone captains have retired without replacements. These same two districts are scheduled to cover the phones at the end of December: District 50 from 12/23/07 through 12/29/07 and district 240 from 12/30/07 through 01/05/08. See the chart for a list of groups in these districts.

Under the current schedule, each of the 17 districts in Suffolk County covers the phones three times per year. Phone captains work with the groups in their districts to provide coverage. As the phone captain for district 90, I can tell you that working with the groups in my community and seeing them fulfill every groups' primary purpose of helping carry the message to the next alcoholic has been one of the most rewarding service experiences I have ever had. Other captains have told me the same thing.

As hotline chair, I encourage outgoing captains to try to find their own replacements, since they are familiar with the folks in their areas who may be qualified for this important job. Whether or not outgoing captains are able to do this, it remains the responsibility of the groups to get someone.

All of the performers are AA members and volunteered their services free of charge.

The overall feedback we received from the guests (non-members as well as members) was that it was the best anniversary they ever attended. I might be a little prejudiced, but I found myself having to agree. Of course that was not our intention. The main objective of celebrating this anniversary was to rejoice and embrace the spirit that makes this group so special. The fellowship that it took to organize this event in such a short time, and with very little money, is a testament to what we can do when we put our collective minds and hearts together.
