We have all pamphlets as well as signage, audio/visual materials, committee workbooks, regional directories, and other service resources.

The group originally met at the Infant Jesus church. The first meeting place was the boiler room and the room had dripping pipes.

The founder of the group may have been Frank X. McF. According to a long time member, Bill, he was known to one and all as Two Fingers Frank, because he was once a demolition man. At least he was the original contact person for the group when it registered in 1981. The meeting first listed in the Suffolk County meeting list in February 1981.

Bill discussed other early members: "Jesus Joe", he used to get up in the front of the room and exhort "if you don't get God, you're going to drink". There was a fellow who was part of the Kennedy White House -a very intellectual person -a professor. His job was to get the cake for anniversaries and he came back with a rum cake. It was discovered in time, so no one's sobriety was compromised. There was another guy who was about 85 years old and used to tell stories about how he still went out caribou hunting.

The group left the original meeting place at Infant Jesus church because of parking problems. If there was an event at the church, you couldn't find a parking spot any place in the area. Then there were these little benches we sat on in the cafeteria. It was like sitting on a grate.

We moved over to Christ Church on Barnum Avenue around November 1999 and it turned out to be a disaster, due to a conflict with church personnel. One by one the old timers started to drop out of the group.

For the last few years the group has been meeting at Mather Hospital. Usually they meet in the conference room, but that is no guarantee.

Start of a tradition:

We had this group member who was a very prestigious, famous scientist and he struggled with the concept of a higher power. He never let it stop him from his quest for sobriety and serenity though. He would share about it often, and I think he finally resolved this seeming paradox with the idea that in science, the proof is in the pudding so to speak. I tried it, it works; hypothesis is proved. Anyway, several months before his tenth A.A. anniversary, he died after a protracted battle with prostate cancer. He died sober.

At the wake, our group's tradition of passing down coins from one member to another came alive. A group member had recently celebrated 11 years, and had that tenth year coin in her purse. Why not? We conferred, and the group conscience led us to slip the coin into our friend's coat pocket. And we sent him off with a fitting tribute to his sobriety.

Ever stop to think and reflect? What if two alcoholics had not come together on the eventful day on May 11, 1935 when Bill W. reached a cross roads and found himself craving a drink while on a business trip in Akron, Ohio?

What if the original meeting of Dr. Bob and Bill lasted fifteen minutes as proposed by Dr. Bill rather than the hours that went by at that first meeting, eventually leading to the formation of Alcoholics Anonymous as we know it to be this day?

Have you ever thought of recovery in these terms; as it applies to you and your own home group? What if that hall was not down the street? What if that man had not reached out his hand to me as I walked through this door?

Chances are we would be back in the bar or some unlit room, hidden in shame and guilt, removed from the guiding light of sober thinking, passed down to us by those who came before. We know this to be true as someone or somebody took the time to 'take notes' to record these occasions. We learn so as not to repeat the past.


