

#### St. James Group

St. James Methodist Church, 532 Moriches Road, St. James

One of the hallmarks of sobriety is a thing called consistency. For those of us in recovery, when we say we are going to be somewhere, we are there. Likewise when we say we aren't going to go somewhere, we are good as our word on that, too. The St. James Group is the model of that very consistency. It has been there as promised! For almost 50 years, it has had its doors open on Mondays and Wednesdays. You can set your watch to that, although the time on the watch would be set back from the St. James' original 9:00PM to its current 7:30PM.

In November 1963, the new group contacted Alcoholics Anonymous World Services to announce its existence. It met then in the St. James Episcopal Church on Route 25A and as was the custom of the time met at 9:00pm. It appears to have met only on Wednesdays in the beginning, but soon thereafter branched out to include Mondays. The new group boasted it had ten members.

The group moved to a new location sometime in spring/summer 1973 and St. James Methodist Church has been its home ever since. It travelled less than 1/3 mile away from its birth place to Moriches Road. Yet it still remained meeting Mondays and Wednesdays. It is not always an easy task to move to a different church and still be able to keep the same days and times. St. James pulled that one off.

The group has done much experimenting with times and different meetings--- as is the case many times with groups---until that right combination can be found. The present configuration has remained stable since the November 2004 meeting list. What wasn't stable was the location in the building of the meetings. According to one member, the church would shuffle them from room to room: one week upstairs in a spacious room, the next weekend crammed in a small crowded room downstairs. This did take its toll and membership dropped. Happily it has been on a steady rise since and now is located in the same room week after week. They have been consistent these St. James A.As and the message they have carried all this time is testament to that.

As a member of an Archive committee, I receive the quarterly Archive newsletter, Markings. This spring's issue had several interesting articles that I would like to bring to your attention. The first was highlights from the National AA Archive Workshop (NAAAWS) that was held in Montana this past September. Preserving the histories of our Long-timers, as well as how our history helps us to carry the message, were topics that were focused on. The SIA Archive Committee has these two topics as part of our 2012 goals, so we are right on target with the NAAAWS! The next National Archive Workshop will be held in October in Florida.

Another article of interest for our county was the "Survey about Our Collection." I have been going over the questions and will be bringing this survey to our Archive Committee when I return in April and asking if they would like us to participate in the survey. Finally, last month, I mentioned the upcoming 62nd General Service Conference. I have often been asked whether anything about Archives is brought up at the Conference. The answer is yes! Last year, based on the need expressed by archive committees in the US and Canada, the Conference Archive Committee requested that an informational piece on the basic archival preservation procedures be created to help local area and district archive committees. The piece was developed by the G.S.O Archive staff and approved by the trustees' Archive Committee and is available for downloading at: http://www.aa.org/lang/en/en\_pdfs/en\_archivespreservations.pdf.

Of course, I have already downloaded it and will be bringing it to the April Archive meeting on the 4th Wednesday of the month @ 8pm at the SIA Office. If you are interested in joining our committee and working on Archives, come down to the meeting! We look forward to seeing you!
