East Northport Serenity

The Evangelical Covenant Church, 203 Cedar Road, East Northport, NY

The East Northport Serenity group is twenty-three years old. It began in September or October of 1986. Anita was one of the founders. The group was made up of former East Northport Valley Group members who wanted a non smoking meeting: thus it was born.

This meeting had a number of geographical relocations. The first home was at the Assembly of God Church at Elwood and Fifth Avenue which lasted for approximately two years. They moved because the church wanted them to sign paperwork regarding legal responsibility in case of injury. The next location was at the Salvation Army building at Larkfield Road and Clay Pitts Road, again lasting several years. Next, they traveled to Christ Lutheran Church on Burr Road but had to seek another home when the Church was undergoing major reconstruction.

Presently, the East Northport Group meets at the Evangelical Covenant Church on Cedar Road, East Northport where they have been for the last decade. Beginners meetings turn out large numbers of attendees and their Step meeting has remained smaller but consistent to this day.

Ronkonkoma Breakfast Club

The Breakfast Club group of Alcoholics Anonymous was first named the "Clubhouse of Suffolk". The group was started in October 1998 by Don A. with the help of Brian D. who was also instrumental in starting the Hope House group in Port Jefferson. The name changed from Clubhouse to Breakfast Club because Traditions guidelines state a group ought not be affiliated with any outside facility.

At first, only a few people showed up, but as time went by, more came. Currently, the hall is filled with up to 50 plus people each Saturday morning. The group has several attractive qualities going for it. It is located for easy access to public transportation and is one minute from the Long Island Expressway.

Don A. registered the group with the Suffolk Intergroup Association and it was put on the meeting list. Though meetings are well attended, it continues to struggle with only a small number of core group members who do the grunt work of running the meeting. Though at times it can create a situation where a few people wear many "hats", it has been an honor to share the work of carrying sobriety's message.

The group enjoys meetings full of honest sharing while maintaining a focus on the basics of our step program. On the first Saturday of every month, there is a bagel, juice and coffee breakfast with the sober attendees and their families at the meeting.

Sometime after the above history was written, The Breakfast Club added a Monday 6:00pm Big Book meeting to its roster.
