The Centereach Group

The Centereach group of A.A. was formed in 1964. At that time A.A. was expanding in Suffolk County and additional groups were needed. All new groups at that time were spin-offs from other large groups. Some of the meetings that the original members attended were Port Jefferson, Riverhead, Smithtown, and Patchogue. Centereach Group is the original name and when it began it had five members. Bill B. and Al S. were two of the first five. In the first two years the group moved a few times. In 1964 the group moved to where it still meets today at St.Cuthbert's in Selden. There is an open meeting on Sundays at 8:30 P.M. Wednesdays, a beginners at 7:00PM followed by a big book and step meeting at 8:30PM.

This is a copy of the original letter from the Centereach Group sent to Alcoholics Anonymous World Services. It was stamped at the office January 31, 1964

Another group is available to the Alcoholics Anonymous Program. This new group is known as the Centereach group. Our neighboring group to the north is Port Jefferson which meets on Mondays and Friday nights and to the south of us is the Ronkonkoma Group that holds its meetings on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

The Centereach Group will hold meetings on Wednesday and Sunday nights at 9:00 p.m. This Wednesday, February 5, will be the election of officers. The actual numbers of these officers will be forwarded to your office in order that this group become a member of the Alcoholics Anonymous family. Meanwhile we appreciate all guidance you can offer.

For years the Centereach Group has been involved in all aspects of A.A. Many of our members have chaired institution meetings. Millie B. was involved in Suffolk intergroup for many years. They also fill the (hotline) phones. It has been involved in 12 step work since its inception. Centereach is an enthusiastic crew. When a member speaks at an outgoing meeting 2 to 3 carloads of members follow for support. The steps are a core part of the group.

The Centereach Group originally met at Grace Presbyterian Church. When it registered in 1964 it claimed to have 9 members. They lost use of the first meeting place and have been meeting at St. Cuthbert's Episcopal in Selden for many years.

There have been a lot of special people pass through the Centereach Group all who died sober members of A.A.: Al S., Pat D., Terry McC., Kerry McG., Bob D., Vinny McP., Millie B., Kenny M. and Ed M. If there was one person who personifies the group it would be Jim O'M., otherwise known as Johnny. He was famous for his saying, "My shoes are nailed to the floor and I'm leaving with the fire department". Johnny had a heart attack and died at a meeting. Never has there been a person who has given more to his fellow alcoholic. His spirit is the thread that runs through the fabric of the Centereach Group.

Original members are all dead but their legacy lives on. It has a crosscut of people all ages from early 20s through late 60s. Sobriety starts with the newcomer to members with over 30 years. With the help of God the Centereach Group will live on for years to come and be ready to help anyone and everyone who passes through our doors.
