**Tradition Twelve** – Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.



### **BLUE POINT TRADITON GROUP**

Henrietta Acampora Sr. Citizen's Center Montauk Highway, Blue Point

Since Barney is one of the original co-founders of the Blue Point Group, we felt that getting it from the "expert" was the way to go. However, Barney insisted that Pat be at his side as he stated "Pat has always been my secretary when it comes to remembering things." Barney further stated that, "Pat and I spoke so much together at open meetings that Pat can tell my story better than I can!" And I suppose that Barney could tell Pat's story, if she let him.

The original co-founders of the Blue Point Group were Barney, Gladys, Frank, George, and John. The Blue Point Group was a branch off from the Bayport Group, as the co-founders of the Blue Point Group were originally members of the Bayport Group.

Bayport's group conscience did not want two meetings a week and Barney felt that two meetings a week were essential in allowing a group to grow. Barney was concerned at having availability of speakers to come in to the group as well as affording speakers from the group to go out and speak, that again two meetings a week were essential for the growth and development of an A.A. Group. Since the Bayport Group would not have two meetings a week, Barney decided to look for a new meeting place.

In 1973, Barney visited Father Charles Murphy of the Blue Point Parish at Our Lady of the Snow church. Father Murphy welcomed Barney and his fellow alcoholics cheerfully and with open arms. Father Murphy was a stringent supporter of A.A. He felt there was a need for it in the Blue Point community. Father Murphy, a non-alcoholic, and Barney, co-founder of the Blue Point Group, sat and discussed and finally decided to have the meeting nights established on Tuesday and Saturday nights. Those nights worked well around the parish's other functions. There was no rent at the very beginning, Then the group paid what it could afford as time went on. It was a very small group in the beginning and there was virtually no money.

A discussion between the co-founders of the Blue Point Group decided that an area between the Patchogue and Sayville Groups should not establish meeting nights that conflicted with those two already established groups. Since Sayville met on Monday and Friday nights and Patchogue met on Thursday and Sunday nights, it was then another deciding factor that Blue Point would meet on Tuesday and Saturday nights. In this way A.A. could continue to serve anybody who needed it, and it did not conflict with other groups.

Pat remembers the early meetings having 5 or 6 members. If only 5 or 6 people attended a Saturday night open meeting, and they were all alcoholics, very often the group would turn it into a closed meeting to allow for the sharing that was needed among those early members. This didn't happen for very long because the group started to grow. Barney says the attendance averaged 5 or 6 members for only several months.

The Blue Point Group of Alcoholics Anonymous today boasts a documented membership of over 70 members with newcomers joining frequently and many first anniversaries celebrated from month to month. On Tuesday nights, when all three meetings are running, there are usually over 100 people in attendance.
