East Quogue - (East Quogue) No more step meetings on 1st Monday.





Earlier this year we mailed over 400 requests to all groups to be included in the new volunteer book. We got back 68 groups that wanted to be in the book. Old Steeples Community Church, 656 Main Road (Rt. 25) BB/S Wednesdays 6:00

This group was founded by Paul M. on December 5, 1996. At the time of the meeting's establishment, Paul had 51 years of sobriety. Paul, who had actually met Bill Wilson, had attended some seminar at the Bill Wilson House in Vermont, and became inspired to begin a meeting on the North Fork, which he believed was in need of another meeting.

Bob, the second member of the meeting, became the coffeemaker, and held the position for the first five years. Bob and Barbara, a husband and wife (Barbara having actually gotten sober at this meeting), also held long term commitments, including the provision of homemade cookies!

The structure of the meeting was unique by today's standards: The book "Bottles and Stools" would be used for the steps 1 through 3 meetings, and the "Little Red Book" – the precursor to the "12 and 12" - for the remaining steps.

Paul even printed free handouts of the Little Red Book with an enclosed history of the "Interpretation of the 12 Steps." The meeting grew such that it eventually required a larger space within the church, and today it usually boasts 30 to 50 people. Though Paul is no longer with us, he left us a lasting piece of his sobriety, which was lengthy, charitable and sincere.
