So Sayville is now west of Sayville West. Somehow that fits nicely. West has always had a reputation of being slightly eccentric. For years it not only allowed cross-talk, it condoned it. Many a guest speaker was taken aback with the flurry of chatter in the background. Never bothered the Westerns.

The group started when two members of the Sayville Group defected. Of course, some long since forgotten resentment was behind the move. Terry and Bob M had less than three years sobriety when they took the plunge. For most of its 35 year history it has met in a classroom at St. Lawrence the Martyr. Those of us who attended a parochial school know the layout well. Not much has changed in Catholic school design.

The initial line up was on Saturday at 8:00 discussion followed a year or so later by a Thursday open discussion. Formats and

# That God Thing

When I made a doghouse, my dog did not understand the function of nails and saw. She didn't, because she couldn't. Her inability to understand did not diminish what she is a dog.

If the gap of understanding between me and my dog is so vast, the gap between me and my creator must be infinite! I was never meant to understand my HP, or His Plan. "Of my own understanding" certainly falls into the category of "Progress". Any "Perfection" in understanding a HP, is completely impossible, and does not diminish what I am, a human. My present understanding of a HP evolved from: "it" did exist, to a judgmental god, to a loving god. And then I tried to go further with how this loving Power could be just and merciful with me, at the same time. I couldn't do it. In my world, doesn't more "mercy shown" indicate less "justice done"?

I now accept my human limitation that my god concept was never meant to be complete. It is only important that I go as far as I can with my understanding, and then accept the limitations for today. My acceptance will avoid any confusion and frustration. Certainly I am not frustrated by the Theory of Relativity since I do not expect to understand it. Einstein was more frustrated than I could ever be. Confusion and frustration will come if I expect to understand the "HP", or even his gifts to us. I no longer see "Free Will" as a defect of God, or a defective gift from God, but as a defect in my species to willfully, and frequently, make bad choices. Evil in the world no longer proves anything to me about god's existence, only about the existence of human selfishness, in the exercising of our free will.

Perhaps the word "Surrender" could also be applied to simply being comfortable with having gone as far as I could today, in my understanding of my HP, or the surrender to the thought that a Power greater than me might actually exist. Any relationship

I might have to a HP shouldn't lead to frustration. How could it? Unless I expect to achieve the understanding of a God, or his Plan.

"As I understand him" leaves out so much about Him, and this is the limitation of being human. AA has never told me what the quality nor quantity of what my belief should be.

"As I understand him" covers the AA spectrum of a punishing god, or a loving power, or merciful, or just, or both at once, and even a belief that it does not exist at all, which is still an understanding, and therefore, is acceptable to AA. If I created a problem with this hp concept, I was expecting too much knowledge about him or his plan. Maybe I am better off if I say, "I will try to understand the things that I am capable of understanding, to accept the concepts that I am not able to understand, and to have the wisdom to know the difference."

"I understand Him" is Perfection. "As I understand Him" is Progress. Rick
