Greenbelt Rec Group VFW 32 Edwards Street Patchogue, NY 11772



The coronavirus shut down meeting place after meeting place. One casualty was the Greenbelt Recreation Center where Holbrook Love N' Share met. This is a municipal building and the odds of it re-opening soon were nil. That didn't stop many members at all. Pop up meetings began. One met outside at Genesis Church in Medford and another in the parking lot of their old meeting place in Holbrook. They would bring a cup of coffee, a beach chair and the desire to stay sober.

For a while it worked nicely. Reality is that fall and winter months bring cold weather and the need for indoor digs became necessary. Many of the regular attendees were wary of computer generated meetings so a search for a shelter was started. Ray K. found the VFW hall in Patchogue and negotiated a rental agreement including insurance. All systems were set, the first meeting scheduled for Tuesday November 3, 2020. However that turned out to be Election Day and the VFW Hall is a polling place. So by default the inaugural date was moved to November 10. As a tribute to their old home group they named themselves after their old meeting place, not knowing if or when they might return there.

According to Ray they were "flying by the seat of his pants." By all accounts those pants held up rather well. Everything went smoothly without a hitch. Peter R was the first speaker. There were 31 in attendance including 28 men and 3 ladies. Social distancing was observed, all chairs were wiped down with disinfectant afterwards and this first meeting went into the record book.

As of this writing, things are still uncertain. At one point there was talk of starting a day meeting but that is on hold right now. Holbrook Love N' Share found a new home in the interim at Abundant Life Church as well as on Zoom. Greenbelt Rec still plugs away every Tuesday at 7:00 PM, offering another option during these trying times.
