Guys & Dolls 425 Hawkins Rd, Selden, NY

The Selden "Guys & Dolls" group was established in April, 1973. Since our group logbook seems to disappear every few years and a new one is started, this history will be necessarily incomplete. The group originally met at the Greek Church on Dare Road in Selden. At some point (prior to 1977) it moved to Grace Presbyterian Church, 425 Hawkins Road, Selden and has been there ever since.

A women's group had started up in the Selden area and some of the local men became resentful at being excluded, so they decided to start their own group. The group was originally a men's group and was called "Guys". With the move to Grace Church, and at the urging of some of the local women who felt that it was against the third tradition to exclude women who had a desire to stop drinking, the decision was made to make the group co-ed and change its name to Guys & Dolls.

Guys & Dolls had an 8:00 meeting on Sundays, an 8:00 closed and concurrent big book meeting on Wednesdays, and on Fridays we had a 7:30 Beginners with concurrent step meeting followed by a 9:00 closed meeting. The 9 O'clock meeting had no time limit and often ran into the wee hours of the morning. It became difficult to get speakers for that meeting because no one wanted to lead a meeting that started at 9PM and often ran until 1 or 2AM so we voted to end the meeting at 10:30 and start another at Midnight on Fridays. It is no wonder that Grace Church got to be known as the house of pain. Many of us old timers didn't like this nickname and so we called it the house of joy.

Guys & Dolls now has only three meetings per week. Our Sunday, Wednesday step and Friday beginners meetings are all at 8:00.

We have had some very unique members. One of our charter members, now deceased, named Bob B., was lovingly called by his nickname "quack-quack". In his early sobriety, quack-quack could not find any higher power other than the big duck that sat in Sag Harbor. He drove there to sit and commune with his higher power, the duck. The big duck was moved to Flanders. It is now a historic landmark. In time Bob

found a conventional entity as his higher power and became an example of spirituality for many members but he is still a "local legend" and I often hear at some of the Western Suffolk meetings about a guy out east who had a duck as his higher power. I had the honor of knowing Bob for many

years of my sobriety and he is missed as is the help and guidance that he has provided for many of us.

One night some of our members decided to leave the meeting early and drive up to Boston to get some ice cream. Who says there is no fun in A.A. Gas was much cheaper in those days.

In 2008 the Archives Committee spoke with one of the

founders and this is his recollections:

Frank got sober in Brooklyn in 1964. He hit bottom when he set a door on fire in a blackout and almost killed a family in the process. This escapade got him on page two of the Daily News. He was facing up to thirty years in prison but through the miraculous intervention of Alcoholics Anonymous and his own sobriety, he never had to go to jail at all. He got a job offer on Long Island to work in a bakery, bought a house and joined the Centereach Group, which was only a few years old at the time. Some of the people he remembered from the early days of Centereach were Terry McF., Kerry McG., Dennis C., Pete C. and Hattie W. He also went to a men's meeting at the American Legion Post on North Evergreen in Selden. The meeting was poorly attended and a few of them tried to-resurrect it in a different form. This new group became Guys & Dolls. One woman suggested that it be a coed meeting and that's how it turned out.

The original members of the Selden Guys & Dolls were Frank, Joe C., Vinnie McP, Bill W., two ladies named Sandy and Edie, and Tom and Joyce D. Tom and Joyce started what would end up becoming The Centereach Open Door group in their home.

Frank remembered one story from the early Guys & Dolls days. One day, a lady came in and said her son was in an accident and was in a hospital upstate. She wanted to visit him in the hospital and she didn't have the financial resources to do so. Frank and Joe decided it would be a nice idea to help her out and proceeded to give her the entire group treasury. Not too long after, reality set in and almost simultaneously they both came to the conclusion that it was not such a good idea after all. Joe and Frank repaid the group out of their own pockets.








May 2022 marks the 49th Anniversary of Suffolk Intergroup
