Brookhaven Women's Group St. James Episcopal Church 260 Beaver Dam Road Brookhaven. NY 11719

On October 7, 1987, the treasurer of the Women's Group wrote a letter to Alcoholic World Services. In this letter, she stated the group was new. (Note: it first appeared in the Suffolk County meeting list more than a year earlier in May 1986.) She also said the group was originally part of Brookhaven Happy Hour.

For the first two years, the schedule was a once a week closed discussion on Wednesday at 6:00 PM. Wednesday was dropped completely in 1988 and Tuesday and Thursday became the standard from there on. The hours were tweaked along the way moving up to 6:30 PM. When a second meeting was added on Tuesday it became 8:00 PM. The Old South Haven Presbyterian Church was its home for many years, as it was the home to all other AA meetings in Brookhaven.

In 2004, a major renovation project was begun at the church and meetings were shuffled to different rooms. The women opted to move to St. James Episcopal down the road. That remains its headquarters and meetings are currently Tuesday and Friday at 6:45 PM.

Many professionals belong to the group, helping to dispel stereotypical views of women and alcoholism, as well as providing positive role models for those ladies who are new to recovery. Every year, the group holds an anniversary party. One member of the Archives Committee remembers attending one and enjoying good food, good music, and good fellowship. That's the ticket for quality sobriety and women of Brookhaven have that down pat.

"I need to find a meeting!"

In the spring of 2017 I moved to Suffolk after having spent two years in Ft Lauderdale, FL. Being only a couple of years sober, I understood very well that my sobriety depended on staying connected to AA and that meant finding a home group, a sponsor and continuing to work my program.

Where to begin? Find a meeting of course. But how do you find meetings when you are new to an area?

Once upon a time, a printed meeting list or a call to the hotline would be the only way to do this. Fortunately, by 2017, meeting lists were widely available online. Finding the online meeting list was one thing, using it was another.

For starters the Suffolk Intergroup website was not mobile friendly. On my smartphone I had to pinch and zoom and scroll and scroll to see much of anything. Secondly I couldn't easily find meetings near me. Being new to the area I didn't know which was closer, Centereach or Centerport. I had to pull out a separate map and figure out what towns were where to find meetings closest to me.

In time I did find meetings and found a group that felt like home. I found a sponsor who supported me in my step work and 'suggested' I start doing service - at the group and below the group level. That's when I first became my group's intergroup rep.

At the time I had no clue what an intergroup was, what it did or why it was needed.

One of the first things I learned about the intergroup was that it was responsible for compiling, printing and making available the county's meeting list. I next learned that there are no meeting list fairies to do this work. Trusted servants at the intergroup had to do the tedious work of receiving, processing, confirming, updating, exporting and printing these meeting lists.

Heck, I understood well why that was so important! A few months later when the webmaster brought up the possibility of Suffolk sharing its information with the Meeting Guide App, a free mobile app newly acquired by AAWS, I jumped at the opportunity to help.

With some time and effort we were able to connect 'our' meeting list to the meeting guide app. Note that by now I did feel like I was part owner of the meeting list. One of the wonderful things about doing service is that you no longer feel like AA is run by 'others'. Instead you come to understand that AA, at every level, is run by 'us', the members of the fellowship.

Finally AAs in Suffolk could easily find meetings closest to them on their smartphones!





Long gone are the days when we had to rely on a printed meeting list, that by its very nature was out of date almost as soon as it was printed. Today, like in the meeting guide app, the Meeting Finder on the SIA website allows visitors to sort through the meeting list by distance and even display all the meetings on one map!

This is due to the generosity of the many tech servants, fellow AAs, who volunteer their time and energy to build and maintain the meeting list and tools needed to display it.

But this is all for naught if the groups do not do their part. SIA asks that all groups update their meeting information, including a group contact on an annual basis.
