#### All R Welcome Hope House 1 High Street Port Jefferson, NY 11777

The pandemic hit Alcoholics Anonymous hard. The number of places willing to let us meet in person was drastically reduced. That was not less so than in Port Jefferson. Even when things let up a little bit, hospitals like St. Charles and Mather kept their doors closed to us. It was in this vacuum that Ray (over 30 years) and Alex (six months) stepped in to fill the void. "There was a need for a Saturday morning meeting."

Saturday morning in Port Jefferson was particularly hard hit. AA lost three face-to-face meetings on Saturday morning. To fill a pressing need, this new group came along to provide some relief. The proof in the pudding was the 23 people who showed up for the first meeting. They had found a new home.

All R Welcome meets 11:00 AM at Hope House. As Ray put it "this is Hope House because here you can find hope." Hope House is certainly no stranger to AA. It has opened its doors to us many times over the years, going back to the 1980s. The large, paneled meeting room will bring back wonderful memories for many of us

The format is open beginners meeting and it is designed to focus on our Big Book. The plan right now is to go line by line, page by page through the first 164 pages. That way, all of those in attendance can get a deeper understanding of our basic text. A paragraph or two is read and then people share about the content. At this point, that format is up for review. The complete particulars of the meeting will be fine-tuned over time, as need be.



The group met for the first time on Saturday, March 5, 2022. Talk about down to the wire. They beat the deadline to appear in the new printed meeting list by one day. By and large, word of mouth helped spread the news about this meeting. It's set up with chairs in a large circle. The gathering was a nice blend of longtime members as well as newcomers. People had traveled from Patchogue as well as Kings Park to experience Suffolk Alcoholics Anonymous' latest addition. From the sound of things, no one was disappointed. An added plus was Alex's delightful daughter Chloe, also in attendance, who may very well win the Best-Behaved Child Award, if there is one. Some of us could learn a thing a two from her about how to act at a meeting.

Ray, who acted as chairperson, set a gentle, welcoming tone to the meeting. "Love more and judge less" he said. Now that's a great way to begin a group.

# **Steps 4-7**

Olga was an old-timer at the Bay Shore Non-smokers Group. She gave me this great metaphor for the "Clean up" and "Grow up" steps, 4-7.

Imagine that you are a shrub or bush that you have neglected for some time due to a disease. You begin to pay attention to the bush. In Step 4, you prune away the dead branches and cut back the excess growth. In Step 5, you call in a more experienced gardener to look at your work. She/he tells you that you missed a whole section on one side and be careful not to cut back the new growth too much because that's an asset! In Step 6, you look at the cuttings and debris and become willing to let it all go. In Step 7, you call in the Garbage man, aka your Higher Power, and ask him/her to remove the debris.

What I love about this metaphor is that it's all about growth. We get pruned by the steps so we can grow! I'm not a bad person trying to get good, but a neglected sick person trying to get well. With careful attention and experienced support, I can clean up my act so I can grow in the image and likeness of my Higher Power.
