Midnight Madness United Methodist Church 107 East Main Street Bay Shore, NY 11706

Midnight meetings have been a Bay Shore mainstay for a long time. Attendance may fluctuate and they have stopped meeting, but ultimately someone steps in and starts another. Usually, the one in Bay Shore is the only midnight meeting in Suffolk County and sometimes even on all of Long Island. It requires a dedicated base of people to keep these going.

The last attempt at a separate night owl meeting like this was in 2016 when the short-lived Happy, Joyous and Free meeting began. It lasted a year. After that there was an almost midnight meeting at 11:59 PM that was part of Bay Shore Daytime Love and Service. People tend to get confused when you post 12:00 AM, thinking that means noontime. Here was an attempt to make it easier to remember. That too didn't last long.

Now along comes Midnight Madness. The starting date has been somehow lost along the way. An educated guess places the first meeting sometime between 2018 and 2020. In the midst of the coronavirus pandemic, it registered as a separate meeting. One moonlit Saturday night, a member of the Archives Committee ventured over to experience Midnight Madness. To his surprise, there were ten people in attendance—nine men and one lady. The format was Big Book. Each person read a



few paragraphs and after that it was open to sharing. It offered the perfect answer to a potentially slippery time for alcoholics—which is the prime reason these meetings are even started at that hour.

The basement area of United Methodist Church is legendary in Suffolk County AA. Affectionately known as the Pit, it has been the source of many wonderful stories. It also has been the source of many people staying sober. For many years, all meetings met in a different part of the basement. The Pit has moved. The same bottom area but in a different part. At best, its decor might be described as perfunctory. The room has never been a candidate for a cover story in Better Homes and Gardens. Usually, people going to a midnight meeting aren't too concerned about what the place looks like. They are mad about staying sober—and will go to any length, at any time, to do so.
