


Alcoholics Anonymous in Suffolk County is a dynamic force. Our basic program of recovery may stay the same, but the means of carrying that message changes regularly. Working within the guidelines of the Twelve Traditions, established groups tinker with the times they meet and the format of their meetings. New groups are created to fill a need. All of this is designed to help others.

Change is ever-present and necessary.

However, the changes experienced during the pandemic years were unheard of. Groups came and went. We said goodbye to many long-time groups. Likewise, we welcomed an unprecedented number of new meetings. Whether online, on the phone or in person, the number of new meetings was twice the amount that normally happens over the course of two years.

These new meetings offered a variety of formats. Some zeroed in on the Big Book. Others replaced groups that shut down. Five of them were specifically set up for women. Four of those were online. Sisters in Spirit was the only face-to-face. It was also the only meditation meeting for any gender.

Natalie and Kelly are the two ladies who saw the need for this Saturday noon meeting for women. They made arrangements with St. John Nepomucene in Bohemia – a friend of Alcoholics Anonymous if there ever was. Many other AA - as well as other Twelve Step fellowships - regularly meet there. There was an opening for noon which suited this new meeting nicely. The format



decided upon was a beginners meditation.

On October 9, 2022, the first meeting was held. An atmosphere conducive to quiet contemplation was created with burning candles. There was apple cider and bagels to help ward off any distracting hunger or thirst. This allowed all participants to focus fully on the meditation. All eight in attendance seemed to get into the spirit of things—-which is the very reason Sisters in Spirit exists.

(According to the recent SIA Meeting list, the group has added a meeting on Wednesday evening at 5:45 PM which features a similar format for women, beginners, and 11th Step Mediation. Both meetings are listed as outdoor meetings, presumably if weather permits.)
