Get Your Step On 1572 5th Avenue Bay Shore, N.Y. 11706

There is a practice in Alcoholics Anonymous called the road trip. Get a few AA friends together and head out to a meeting. Maybe one of you is scheduled to speak. Maybe you just want to hit a different meeting. Whatever the reason, there is usually good fellowship on the ride there and back. Sometimes truly great things happen during these road trips.

Zack, George, Brandon, Willie and James had already hit a meeting when the idea struck them to shoot for one more. All are relatively new to Alcoholics Anonymous and the fires of recovery are burning brightly in them. Hitting two meetings in one evening is not such a far-fetched idea.

One night their excursion brought them to a meeting at Grupo Hispano in Bay Shore. One of them was invited to tell his story, which he did in Spanish. Others shared theirs in English. It was a bilingual celebration of recovery. Out of that came an invitation to start a meeting there.

Grupo Hispano, like many other Spanish language groups in Suffolk County, rents a large space monthly. They have to; they meet nine times a week. Outside of the times they meet, the room is mostly unused. Why not let another group use that time. This may be the first time an English meeting will be meeting at a Spanish meeting place in Suffolk. It is surprising more groups haven't set up similar arrangements.

Since Spanish groups rent their space by the month, they are free to decorate their spot as would any other business renting space. The room is painted a festive bright green. Posters announcing upcoming Spanish group anniversaries in the tri-state area are hung on the walls. The most impressive innovation is the different way the letters "AA" are worked into the decor. They are on the glass front door and the floor tiles have not one but two large ones. There is no doubt whatsoever who meets here.

The five friends went to work immediately and kicked around ideas. They came up with both a format and a name for their new meeting. The focus will be on the Twelve Steps.



Get Your Step On Bayshore

It is important to them to get the message out there to those who are suffering from our disease. That would be reflected in their name: Get Your Step On.

Saturday January 7, 2023 at 6:00 PM was the first meeting. One half hour before starting time, at least ten people had arrived. It is unusual for any meeting, much less a brand new one, to have so many people show up so early. For the last few weeks, the co-founders had been spreading the word around town. Their work paid off. By starting time, the early birds would be joined by another 20 to bring the total to 30 in attendance.

Jon from Young at Heart in Islip/The Safe Space was the first speaker. He shared wonderfully on the first three Steps. He would be returning the next three Saturdays to complete the cycle. Each week will cover three Steps. It was emphasized repeatedly that he was sharing his experiences on the Steps, not teaching them.

In addition, he spent time discussing Step Zero. That's when a person stops drinking but is woefully stuck because they have no program of recovery. Sooner or later the pain will re-emerge and may lead to a very uncomfortable sobriety or even a relapse.

Many people have shared over the years about the things that can happen on a road trip. People bond more closely with each other. Sometimes, they laugh until their sides hurt. Once in a while they start the ball rolling to get a new meeting going. When that happens, we all benefit.

DOES YOUR GROUP HAVE A GENERAL SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE??? HOW ABOUT A SUFFOLK INTERGROUP REPRESENTATIVE???

If not, your Group is not a part of the larger world of Alcoholics Anonymous and is not only isolated from most service work but has no voice in the future of our Fellowship. Almost as important, your Group is denying its members information about activities, both social and service oriented, taking place in Suffolk County and the South Eastern New York Area to which all local groups belong.

The General Service Representative (GSR) has the job of linking his or her group with A.A. as a whole. The GSR represents the group at the District, County and Area levels, bringing your Group's opinions, news and problems to the District Committee Member and to the Delegate, who then passes them on to the conference. The GSR is perhaps the most important role in AA. It is through their GSR that each group has a voice and a vote in larger AA matters. This connection helps keep AA unified, both in a practical sense and spiritually.

Intergroup is another type of A.A. service entity, "directly responsible to those they serve," as described in Tradition Nine. Here in Suffolk County, Suffolk Intergroup (SIA) and Suffolk General Service (SGSO) coordinate with each other to complement and divide up the county's service needs. Suffolk Intergroup is, basically, the "boots on the ground" part of our service structure. Among many services, SIA coordinates the Suffolk Hotline for those in crisis and seeking help, publish our county-wide meeting list, bring meetings to jails and institutions and publish a monthly newsletter. Both organizations hold special workshops and meetings and serve as clearinghouses for public information.


Local group representatives reflect the groups' conscience in A.A.'s service operations.

At group business meetings, your Group Representatives report on the activities and pending decisions in Intergroup and Area committee activities, often sparking discussions among group members that provide the GSR and Intergroup rep with a feel for how our service organizations can better serve the groups' needs. In group recovery meetings, Group Representatives make available fliers announcing area and regional activities.
