There is a Solution St. Mark's Episcopal Church 754 Main Street Islip, N.Y. 11751

Three members of the then Bay Shore Non-Smokers (now called Bay Shore Sobriety) started this group: Dave Mc, Bruce B, and Steve S. Bruce met with the pastor of St. Mark's, who believed itwould be a wonderful ministry for the church.

The three of them had tried in vain to impress upon their old group that "the Twelve Steps are the main reason for Alcoholics Anonymous." The 8:00 PM Step meeting at the group was getting very little business and when a Traditions meeting was scheduled, "no one showed up." There was an overemphasis on newcomers and they have "really nothing to tell us." When they tried to raise group awareness and brought this up at business meetings, it would be voted down. And the ones voting it down didn't even attend Step meetings!

After repeated attempts were made, the decision was made to start this new meeting. The name chosen is the title of Chapter 2 in the Big Book.

The original plan was to meet on Monday and Wednesday, but unbeknownst to them, another lady negotiated for the Wednesday slot to start the Serenity at Seven meeting. So, they ended up with Monday and Friday, the same two days the old group met, fueling accusations that this was being done deliberately. One person even called them a "communist group." Their first meeting was on May 8, 2005.



Back then, there were two circles for people to sit - an inner one which filled up quickly and anouter one. It was designed to give everyone a chance to speak. It also encouraged people to come early - the early bird gets those inner seats. To speed things along and make it fair for all, a time limit was imposed, limiting each person to a two-minute share. The speaker would stand in the middle of the circle. It was nothing to have 60 to 90 people showing up for their meetings.

Times changed. The group took a long time to bounce back after the pandemic in 2020. But their numbers are nothing like the halcyon days.

They still met upstairs in this cavernous room, but the circles are a thing of the long past. Even two of the original co-founders left in 2015 to start yetanother group - The Trudge Group, also in Islip.

Despite the changes, there is some solid, long-term sobriety showing up each week. They know there is a solution and are keeping their doors open for all those seeking it.


Santa Claus is Drinkin This Year

You better live life one day at a time, 'Cause Santa Claus is drinking this year!


